Dear Friends and Supporters,

Each week, three times during that week, a SADS volunteer (or staff member) undertakes a long and tiring journey to various country municipal animal pounds to rescue dogs and some cats which would otherwise be killed.

These are rescue missions.

The SADS vehicles have been donated by generous SADS supporters, and their maintenance and the fuel they use, is funded through monetary donations to SADS.

Back at the SADS shelter the staff and volunteers prepare for the arrival of the new animals with a great sense of dedication to this work of saving these companion animals. But mixed with this rallying to help is the apprehension of knowing that, unavoidably, some will arrive stressed and frightened from the journey and in general poor physical and mental condition. Will they need to be carried into the shelter? Will they be so undernourished that they will require small but regular feeds at first, or will they require immediate veterinary treatment? The doors of the vehicle are swung open and the love of the waiting arms is palpable. Some of the longer haired dogs may be so unkempt and matted that walking is difficult ,almost all will be filthy with dull coats, while others will have gross skin conditions.

It is SADS job now to start the care and assessment process of each individual. Some of these dogs and cats will live in the shelter but a short time, and once the quarantine time and routine and special needs veterinary work is completed will leave to go into permanent or foster homes. Others, and especially the large active dogs with social issues, will stay longer ,sometimes a lot longer , before we are comfortable that they can be transferred to the appropriate permanent home.

This work is what you believe in and what you have enabled SADS to do on your behalf through your generous help and support in so many ways.

Barry came to Save A Dog Scheme as an unclaimed animal from SADS own contractual work with the City of Stonnington. He was terribly matted and neglected and once we could actually see his face, sadly it transpired his eye had to be removed.



When Roxy was unloaded from the country it became apparent that she had an eye compliant. The eye specialist informed us that she has a condition called "pannus", meaning that her eyes react adversely to ultraviolet light (the sun). SADS has managed to arrest the progress of this condition but some damage was already done meaning she will be on eye medication for the rest of her life.

Save-A-Dog Scheme (SADS) was established in 1985 to offer a humane alternative to the killing of unwanted dogs, especially dogs of good temperament, that would otherwise be destroyed at pounds and shelters.

SADS is an incorporated, non-profit, community based organisation controlled and operated by volunteers with the help of paid staff. It operates as a registered animal shelter and combines this with foster care in the community. Each animal is desexed, vaccinated, wormed, microchipped, flea treated, vet checked and temperament assessed prior to adoption.

SADS has a no kill philosophy and believes that the dichotomy of a dog being "Mans Rest Friend" on the one hand and an unwanted, article for destruction on the other is

totally unacceptable. SADS is a "coal-face" organisation, which saves hundreds of dogs and now cats each year and which seeks, by example, to provide a better way of treating non-human animals.

Save-A-Dog Scheme relies on donations for its continuing existence. Donations to Save-A-Dog Scheme are tax deductible and help with the general care of the animals and the maintenance of the organisation.

The greatest expense is for veterinary treatment for the animals, which includes the care of the sick and injured. These cats and dogs are nursed back to health rather than being destroyed as they may be elsewhere.
