In line with our no-kill policy, sick & injured animals are nursed back to health at SADS rather than being euthanased, as they may be elsewhere. We take cats and dogs with a variety of often serious medical problems and do our best to ensure the animal will have the best medical care possible, and a chance to start a new and happy life. This often involves expensive medical treatment. Meet some of the dogs and cats we're so glad to have been able to help. Without us, the outcome for them may have been very different.

Tett's Story

Jett arrived, just months old with elbow dysplasia which could not go untreated. We knew it would be expensive, and a long rehabilitation period, but we couldn't look the other way, we were her last chance. Jett has now had her specialist surgery, but it was a difficult case and could be completely rectified but she will



have a more pain free, good quality life.

She has been in a long recuperation period being nursed by our staff and volunteers. Week one was a strict rest period, and she has been slowly introduced to an exercise regime, gaining more mobility as each day passes. She now loves lying in the sun and greeting all the people who pass by. Jett has a follow up x-ray soon, and then, hopefully, will be ready to start a new life.

Save-A-Dog Scheme (SADS) was established in 1985 to offer a humane alternative to the killing of unwanted dogs, especially dogs of good temperament, that would otherwise be destroyed at pounds and shelters.

SADS is an incorporated, non-profit, community based organisation controlled and operated by volunteers with the help of paid staff. It operates as a registered animal shelter and combines this with foster care in the community. Each animal is desexed, vaccinated, wormed, microchipped, flea treated, vet checked and temperament assessed prior to adoption.

SADS has a no kill philosophy and believes that the dichotomy of a dog being "Mans

totally unacceptable. SADS is a "coal-face" organisation, which saves hundreds of dogs and now cats each year and which seeks, by example, to provide a better way of treating non-human animals.

Save-A-Dog Scheme relies on donations for its continuing existence. Donations to Save-A-Dog Scheme are tax deductible and help with the general care of the animals and the maintenance of the organisation.

The greatest expense is for veterinary treatment for the animals, which includes the care of the sick and injured. These cats and dogs are nursed back to health rather than being destroyed as they may be elsewhere.



Odin's Story

Odin arrived at just 4 months of age as a voluntary surrender. He had been diagnosed with Addison's disease, where the adrenal gland has lower than normal production of hormones, and was very unwell, and so we agreed to take him on and further investigate and treat his condition.

Odin has been prescribed an ongoing medication regime and a plan for living a long and happy life with his new family and all his dog friends in the park. He is now a bouncy, young, happy pup with a typical Labrador personality!

Bea's Story

Bea arrived at 4 months of age, the sweetest little pug x. She came to us from a very kind person who rescued her but was not able to offer her a permanent home.

Bea had an eye removed when she was very young. It is thought her mother may have kicked her, causing damage. The eye operation was not overly successful in that somewhere at the base of the eye socket air was leaking in and the eye cavity was filling with air and swelling. Our vet opened the eye socket, found the leak and sealed it making her much more comfortable.

Now Bea can head off to a busy active puppy life! She is a very wriggly, friendly, sweet pup. She yaps with excitement when she sees other dogs as she wants to play. She will be a lovely family dog.
